# IMPORTANT: CHILD PROTECTION GUILDLINES FOR PARENTS ENTERING THE SCHOOL DURING SCHOOL HOURS

Parents **must not** wait in the school corridors from 9.00am to 3.00pm, during school hours. During the school day, children use the corridors to access the school toilets and to move to other areas of the school. If adults enter the school and stand near classroom doors and close to school toilets this compromises the safety of our children. Again, I ask parents to refrain from this practice. When parents wait in the corridors it also makes it difficult for classes to move freely along the corridors and for teachers to ensure that all children are properly supervised.

We appreciate that some parents may arrive early to collect their children from school and with this in mind we have made the canteen available for parents to stand in from the rain or cold.

Primary One and Two children who wish to attend after school club until 3pm must remain at the club until 3pm. Children will then be taken out to the playground by our staff and parents can collect them there.
